Primary Purpose

Master of the RV Penghana which involves oversight of the vessel and associated maintenance and supply procedures. To provide technical advice on aspects of marine ecology and associated maritime procedures, and assist in the instruction of students as required.

Level of Responsibility/Direction and Supervision

Responsible for the safe and effective operation of the RV Penghana and its maintenance requirements. Responsible for up to 30 persons when at sea.

The occupant operates under general direction and supervision by the supervisor. When at sea the Master has overall responsibility for all activities on the vessel.

It is the responsibility of the occupant to actively participate, promote and model behaviours which are consistent with the Department's commitment to the safety and wellbeing of children and young people. This includes the prevention, identification and



reporting of child abuse and behaviours which are not consistent with the Department's values.

The occupant is responsible for complying with all Agency policies and procedures, including those relating to fraud and corruption control, record management, confidentiality, conduct and behaviour, mandatory reporting, education, training and assessment.

The Department has a range of delegations across the operational portfolio's which include Finance, People Services and Support (HR) and Facilities. The occupant is responsible for ascertaining the delegations that are assigned to these duties and is expected to exercise any applicable delegations prudently and in accordance with a range of Acts, Regulations, Awards, administrative authorities and functional arrangements.

Primary Duties

- 1. Skipper the RV Penghana as required in accordance with Australian maritime laws and standards.
- 2. Supervise the safety of the crew, passengers and vessel.
- 3. Lead the annual slipping and survey to survey requirements.
- 4. Maintain vessel log books on a daily basis and associated inventories.
- 5. Advise teachers and students on RV Penghana's attributes and equipment, and boating and safety procedures.
- 6. Oversight the bunkering and supply of equipment for the vessel.
- 7. Assist in the maintenance of all plant and equipment held by the Centre in consultation with the supervisor.
- 8. Make, interpret and apply weather observations.
- 9. Undertake minor maintenance tasks for the Centre in consultation with or as directed by the supervisor.
- 10. The incumbent can expect to be allocated duties, not specifically mentioned in this document, that are within the capacity, qualifications and experience normally expected from persons occupying positions at this classification level.
- 11. In accordance with the *Work Health and Safety Act 2012* the incumbent will actively participate in and contribute to the maintenance of safe working conditions and practices, including the development and implementation of improvement initiatives, safeguarding practices and all mandatory training requirements.

Selection Criteria

The following specific selection criteria must be addressed by candidates. The nominated position objective and duties contained in this statement of duties must also be used to assist in the interpretation of these selection criteria.

- 1. Proven experience as a Master of a research or fishing vessel, including extensive knowledge of marine navigation and safety legislation.
- 2. Sound knowledge of shipboard safety and emergency practices and procedures, and the ability to communicate these to students of all ages.
- 3. Highly developed interpersonal and communication skills, and the ability to interact effectively with both teachers and students of all ages.
- 4. Practical knowledge and understanding of meteorological data, weather forecasting and interpretation.
- 5. Sound knowledge and skills in relation to maintenance of research or fishing vessels and associated machinery.
- 6. Personal skills of initiative, innovation, self-motivation and the capacity to work well in a team environment with minimal supervision.
- 7. A demonstrated capacity to commit to the Department's values, with the ability to apply them through individual behaviours and actions.

Requirements

Registration/licences that are essential requirements of this role must remain current and valid at all times whilst employed and the status of these may be checked at any time during employment. It is the employee's responsibility to advise the Department if there is any change to the status of a registration/licence. This includes notifying the Department of any new criminal charges or convictions and/or if a registration/licence is revoked, cancelled or has conditions applied.
